# About Carbon School

Carbon School is a Pre-K through Grade 9 school with an enrollment of 58 students and a pre-K class operated by our supportive Parent Association.

We are a part of the Tri-Campus Schools, which includes Acme School, Dr. Elliott School and Carbon School. We actively plan activities and professional development to make connections between students and staff as we grow as a Tri-Campus. Although we have class configurations that are double and even triple-graded for specific grades, we pride ourselves on having welcoming and encouraging homeroom settings where students achieve academically and find support for their overall well-being. An example is our school lunch program, where students receive a free lunch every school day. This has guaranteed that students are filled and fueled for learning throughout the day.

Staff members are dedicated to creating innovative and engaging learning activities that are multileveled and differentiated. An example of this is a combined grade 3-6 reading and writing Language Arts program that has each student working at their level with multiple teachers and educational assistance supporting in that environment. Junior High students have the opportunity to work on their core subjects in the morning at Carbon School and collaborate with the students from Dr. Elliott for their option classes in the afternoon.


Although our enrollment is low, we acknowledge that handling multiple curricula in a single classroom is taxing. We cycle courses where possible to allow for dedicated instruction of a single curriculum in a combined classroom.

We work with our supportive Parent Advisory Council to initiate and support programming that supports academic and social programs and extracurricular activities. We connect with community groups and businesses to provide opportunities for students.

# At Carbon School, we aim to provide students with the support, services, and environment that fosters success for each student.


#### Strategies:

- Junior High participates in career exploration, entrepreneurship, home economy, shopping, and tourism through this year's option classes. These electives are based on real-world experiences.




#### Stratagies Continued:

- Students will look at career possibilities, create resumes, identify strengths using My Blueprint and participate in projects with real-world implications.




#### **Stratagies Continued:**

#### Welcoming, Caring, Respectful and Safe Learning Environment



In order to engage parents with our school community, we work to provide multiple opportunities for families to give input and connect to our school, administration, and teachers.

- Weekly updates are sent to each family by email.
- Updates are provided through social media, the school website, and the monthly newsletter.
- Parent volunteers are encouraged and welcome.
- Continue the close working relationship with our parent advisory council.
- Involve parents in collaborative decision-making.
- Constant communication with parents regarding students' Individual Program Plans.









We are working to foster citizenship in our students by having them participate in our morning routines of playing O' Canada, announcements, and our daily motivational "Believe in You" messages. Students will participate in our annual Terry Fox Run, Remembrance Day ceremony, town clean up, Gifts for Grandparents and other community events. Each year, our school hosts a Sr. Tea. Additionally, our Students help with the daily clean-up process for our school lunch program.

We constantly promote a positive school culture by connecting students from different grades to work collaboratively to complete projects. This connection will benefit all students by fostering leadership and creating a safe environment where younger students can reach out to the older ones. We often refer to our core values (Empathy, Perseverance, Cooperation, Integrity and Personal Excellence.) These values help guide all of us in developing resilience and keeping us physically and emotionally healthy. Teachers dedicate time in their day to promote mindfulness, positive self-talk and growth mindset.

We will continue to increase parental communication through the website, Facebook, Instagram, open houses, and presentations of what we do. We will encourage students to get involved in their school and community.




## **Goal 2** First Nations, Metis and Inuit Students are Successful

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
#### Strategies:

- Careful planning and increased instructional time have allowed us to maintain split grades throughout K-6.
- Our Gr. 7-9 core subjects remain triple-graded, but we cycle our Social Studies and Math programming, so it operates like a split grade.
- Junior High students travel to Dr. Elliott School each afternoon to participate in a broad range of CTF and option courses, connect with peers and participate on sports teams.
- We provide a licensed preschool that operates within our school building and provides continuity of programming for our students.



#### **Strategies:**

- We provide a free daily lunch program for K-9 students, ensuring students are nourished and ready to learn throughout the day. This program is possible due to continual community support.
- Our programs focus on developing the characteristics of successful learners and lifelong learning. These are reinforced and modelled through our diverse programming.
- Our teachers can access division-wide professional development regarding Powerful Learning and the new provincial curriculum.
- We encourage parents to stay connected to their child's learning through involvement on our Parent Council, through PowerSchool, by attending Parent Teacher Interviews and by inviting parents to attend school events such as our pancake breakfast, Remembrance Day, Terry Fox Run, and Christmas celebrations.
- Our Elementary students can participate in mini-raiders and swimming lessons to learn the basics of school sports and have fun.
- We encourage parents to volunteer in the school to connect with our teachers and students' excellent work and collaboration.
- We celebrate student success and highlight diverse, collaborative, community-based education on our website through social media and school newsletters.
- We develop citizenship, cross-graded collaboration and leadership opportunities in our programming to establish a positive and caring community.



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# Facilities and Capital Plan

We continue to allocate our resources to best support our students. We focus on having as many trained staff and educational assistants working with our students as possible. We are continually grateful to access nutrition grants from the Alberta Government and donations from our community supporters for our lunch program for K-9 students.
