

Since the 1979-1980 school year, Dr. Elliott School and Acme School, alongside the vibrant communities of Linden and Acme, have thrived as a Bi-Campus partnership, celebrating over four decades of collaboration.

In 2011, we expanded our community by welcoming Carbon School into the fold, transforming our alliance into a Tri-Campus system. Now, Junior High students from Acme attend Dr. Elliott for a full day of learning, while Carbon Junior High students join us in the afternoons for specialized option and Career and Technology Foundations (CTF) courses. For high school, students from Acme, Carbon, and Linden converge at Acme, fostering a united academic journey.

Dr. Elliott School is a K-9 institution, home to approximately 198 students and a dedicated team of 18 staff members. Our school boasts a rich legacy of innovation and excellence, shaping engaged and proud citizens. 


Grade 6 PAT Results



Due to the New Language Arts and Math Curriculum, a pilot PAT program was available to school which Dr. Elliott opted out of resulting in no data collection for these areas.



Family Wellness Collaboration: Our partnership with the Family Wellness Worker remains strong, focusing on the overall well-being of our students through additional support services.



Through these efforts, we strive to create a richer, more inclusive educational journey for all.








Goal 3Literacy and Numeracy Success for all Learners


Our priorities to support literacy and numeracy success include:

GHSD Numeracy Assessment








Our Results






Goal 4: Promote Well-Being through Positive Relationships and Skill Building

- Creative Arts


