In addition we have approximately 100 International students and 35 Siksika students that attend Strathmore High School.

Overall Summary

Strathmore High School (SHS) continues to demonstrate strong performance in our academic results, maintaining high levels of Student Learning Engagement and Citizenship. SHS Provincial Diploma examination results are consistently above provincial results, and we have exceptional results in our Math and Science courses. We recognize that we have some areas that we will continue to focus on. It is essential to consider our significant International student population and English Language Learners, which can impact standardized testing outcomes. We continue to develop strategies that address the unique needs of our diverse student body while striving for academic excellence. Additionally, we take great pride in our community connections, with many partnerships with businesses for work experience and our community service and volunteering.

This year, we have changed our timetable to implement FLEX time. FLEX time allows students 30 minutes a day to get personalized and direct learning support to either catch up or re-introduce concepts in each particular course. FLEX time also allows teachers to offer enhancement activities so that students can have more (and deeper) learning experiences.



SHS will continue to work on professional development through our work with Dr. David Tranter's *Third Path,* focusing on Belonging and Positivity.










High School Completion Rates





Goal 1 Every Student is Successful Our Results

At Strathmore High School, we commit to providing diverse educational opportunities for all our students. While this approach may occasionally impact overall academic metrics, we believe it fosters greater personal growth and expands post-

secondary options for our students. Our academic courses (Physics, Chemistry, Biology, AP Math) exemplify our school's high standards, the positive approaches to

courses with high rigor needed to cover the curriculum, and the exceptional achievements of our students. These programs serve as a testament to the academic excellence attainable at SHS.

The satisfaction rates at SHS are consistent with provincial averages across all stakeholder groups (teachers, parents, and students). This high level of satisfaction reflects our success in offering a comprehensive curriculum that includes fine arts, career and technology studies, and health and physical education.

While our at-risk programming accessibility aligns with Authority and Provincial trends, we recognize the need for improvement. A growing concern shared across Alberta is the increase in attendance issues, which creates barriers to effectively supporting at-risk students. In Alberta, student absenteeism has become a significant challenge, and our school is facing these trends as well.

Excessive absenteeism can significantly impede academic progress, and poor attendance is a strong predictor of increased dropout rates. We are committed to working collaboratively with parents, guardians, and students to address these challenges. By prioritizing school attendance, students are more likely to achieve academically and develop a positive attitude towards their educational progress. Regular attendance also cultivates habits that extend beyond high school, preparing students for the expectations of the professional world. Our goal is to continue to communicate with parents/guardians and try to support all students collaboratively as a team.

Strathmore High School is dedicated to deepening foundational knowledge and celebrating Indigenous culture and perspectives. We actively participate in the division-wide First Nations, Métis, and Inuit Committee, collaborating regularly to share resources and plan meaningful cultural connections. Our FNMI Liaison organizes cultural experiences, including multiple field trips and visits to the school by elders, to enrich learning. We partner with Instructional Coaches to facilitate activities like the floor map exercise, which enhances students' understanding. Through staff meetings and professional development, our teachers continually expand their knowledge and integrate Indigenous Ways of Knowing into the curriculum.

We proudly observe National Truth and Reconciliation Week, recognize Orange Shirt Day with impactful classroom learning, and celebrate Indigenous History Month with engaging activities and games involving students and staff.

Each year, Strathmore High School participates in the GHSD Warrior and Princess Pagent, the GHSD demonstration PowWow, and we host a graduation PowWow for FNMI graduates in GHSD.


New Blood

SHS has produced and showcased New Blood for 10 years now. New Blood is a drama performance based on the life of Chief Vincent Yellow Old Woman. Through dance, drama, and poetry, it shows the history of residential schools and reconciliation. Set to the music of Peter Gabriel, it explores the impact on Yellow Old Woman, who went into a residential school at the age of five and left 10 years later.

New Blood has been performing all across Canada over the last 10 years and continues to be a sought-after viewing for organizations, school divisions, and communities.




Our Results
