Our commitment to the professional development of our teachers is reflected in the success of student PAT scores, which continue to exceed the provincial average.

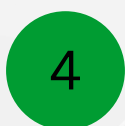
Citizenship and parental involvement are areas we will focus on improving. We intend to increase parental involvement through our School Council. Through communication and engagement, we hope to connect to more parents.

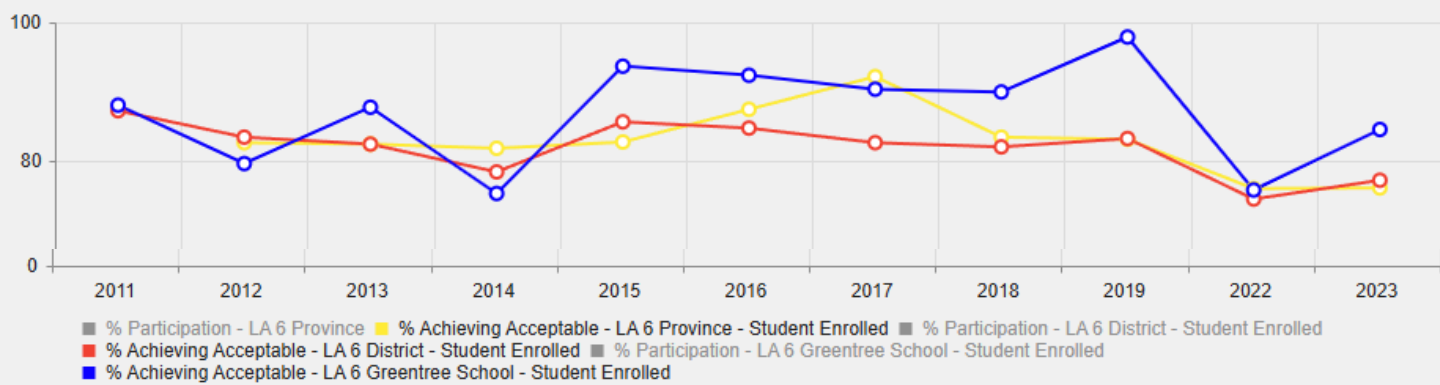

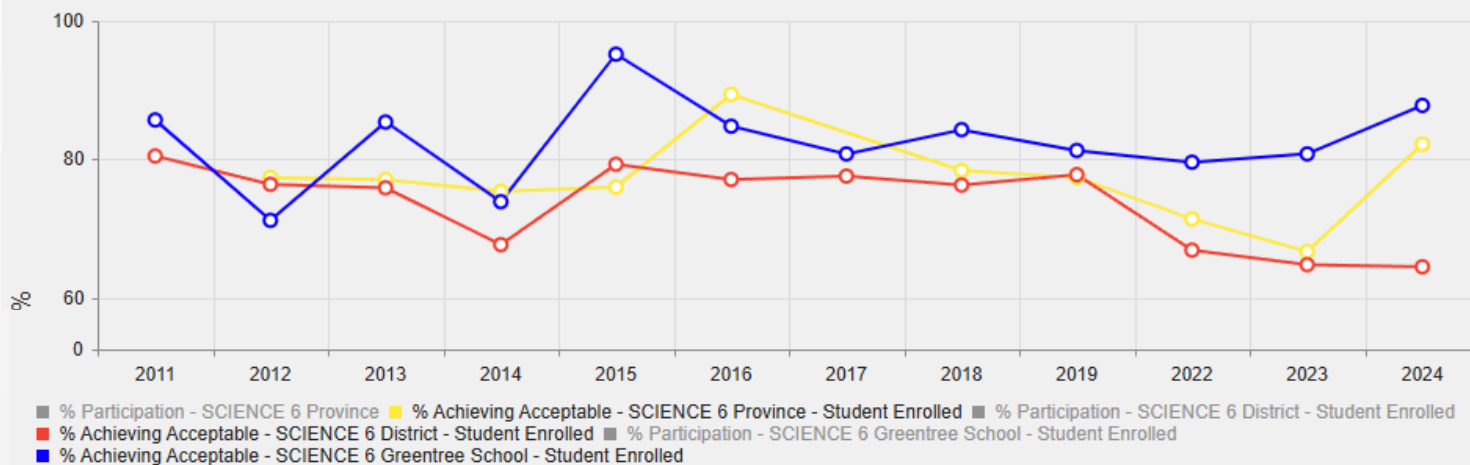

PAT Achievement Trends: Students Enrolled for Greentree School (LA 6)



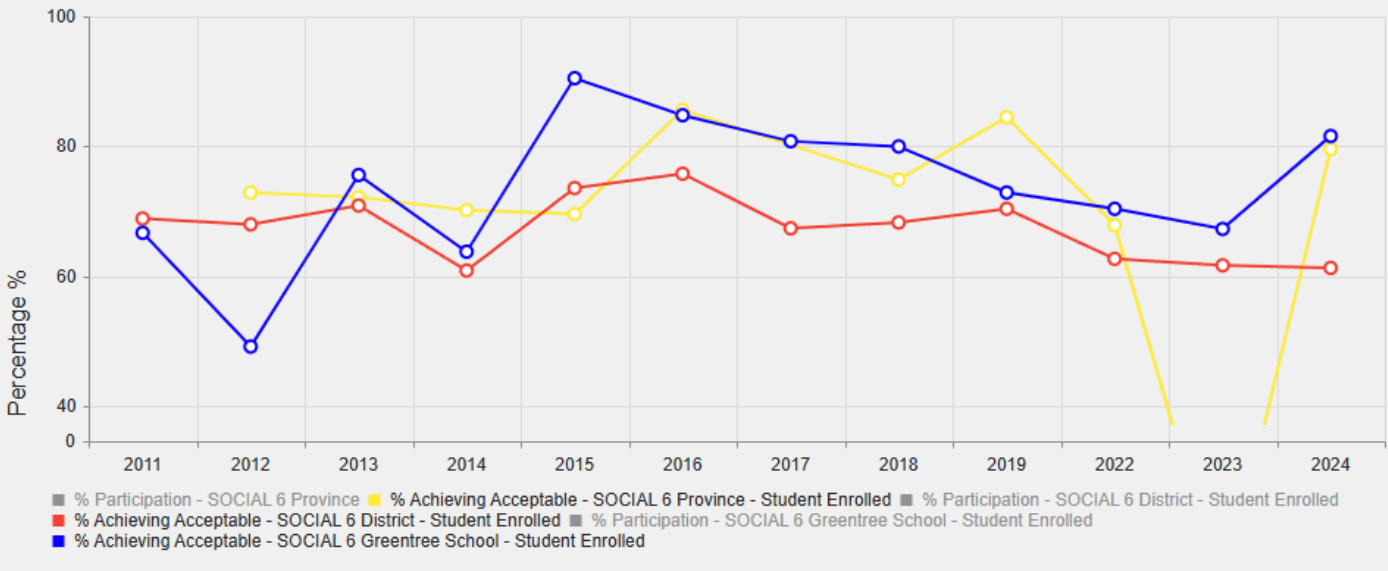
PAT Achievement Trends: Students Enrolled for Greentree School (SCIENCE 6)



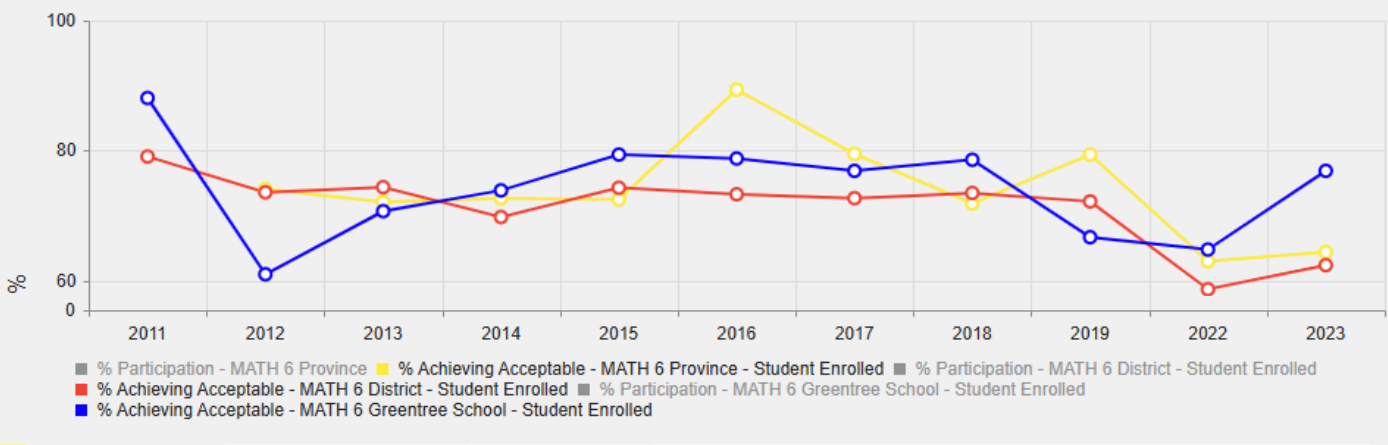

To ensure students' continued success, we will support teachers in developing programs, lessons, and experiences through Professional Learning Communities (PLCs). These PLCs allow teachers from various grades to increase their professional competencies and affect student success.

The success of play-based learning, as seen in our 12 Days of Mathmas initiative, allows students in different grades to play together to build community while increasing confidence in foundational math skills.

We will also continue to reach out to community members to read one book with our students, engaging all students, their families, senior citizens, and community celebrities to read each chapter together on the same day, making literacy a communal effort.

Finally, we will support teacher initiatives to enhance student learning. Greentree's highly effective teaching team has big dreams for our students that can be obtained through professional development sessions, connecting with instructional coaches, and reaching out to in-house expertise. We will continue to support teachers as they strive for powerful learning environments.

GOAL 3 Fostering Active Citizenship

Our students engage in buddy classes, where students in a division one classroom and students in a division two classroom collaborate in various activities throughout the year.

They read, play math games, help learn new concepts and work on art projects, among many other activities.

For many years, Greentree students have been awarded SEEDS rewards to recognize their actions that support citizenship. When caught supporting others, exploring possibilities, engaging in learning, doing the right thing, or striving for success, students are celebrated in their classrooms and again in the office when they enter their seed in a draw to win prizes. These SEEDS are also displayed on the tree in the hallway, making their good deeds public and continually acknowledged.

Our discipline approach also builds citizenship skills by helping students understand their effect on those around them. Conflicts are resolved through a process that involves each student becoming aware of the problem, acknowledging their actions, atoning for the behaviour using natural consequences, and planning for improved actions going forward. All students involved work together through this process whenever possible.





GOAL 3 Fostering Active Citizenship

We aim to address concerns about building citizenship skills in our students by seeking a deeper understanding of what citizenship means to our stakeholders.

We asked our Parent Council what citizenship means for them and their students. Here is what they said:

- “bringing the community together”
- “creating connections in the community”
- “Including children, adults, and seniors in community events”
- “People working together to further the interests of their community”
- To create opportunities for “young and old to come together to see that everyone has value”
